Since 2010 I have a regular teaching obligation of at least two to three courses per year. I taught courses, seminars, and lectures in German and in English for both Bachelor and Master students at four different universities in three different European countries – Germany, Switzerland, and Denmark. My teaching covers a variety of topics based on my research focus and ranges from very specific seminars to very broad lectures. The main topics were race and ethnicity, attitudes towards immigrants in a comparative perspective, cultural foundations of economic and political behaviour as well as general societal challenges of disadvantaged groups and methodological issues.
